(SEE THE FOLLOWING ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS BELOW)

Trophy or Plaque will be awarded for Junior Best Doe in Show and Senior Best Doe in Show

Only two (2) entries per class

All goat entries must be made on or before Friday July 16, 2010. **No late entries will be accepted. No entries will be taken the day of the show, no switching of classes is not allowed.** There will be no exception to this rule. Goats staying all week must be in place by 4 P.M. on Sunday, the 2nd day of the fair. No animals will be allowed to leave before 8 P.M. on Sunday, the last day of the fair.

The rules printed herein are made a part of conditions which all entries of the exhibitor are made, and exhibitors are respectfully requested to read them carefully thereby avoiding confusion at the time of fair.

1. **Show time for Franklin County Dairy Goat Show is Wednesday. Open show will begin at 8 A.M. The show may have two rings and two judges, depending on the number of animals entered.**
2. The Franklin County Dairy Goat Show is limited to Franklin County residents, with the exception of those who stay all week.
3. See rules and regulations for ADGA Sanctioned Show.
4. Barn space will be provided only for those animals staying on grounds all week.
5. **Exhibitors Meeting: Date to be determined; all exhibitors wishing to stay all week must attend this meeting to be assigned barn space. This would also include any 4-H animals planning on staying all week.**
6. Entries staying all week (from the first Sunday to the last Sunday of the fair) will receive a 20% increase in premium money.
7. Junior Does in all breeds will show first, then Senior Does.
8. As soon as Best Doe in Show is complete, the ring must be cleared and cleaned.

9. Exhibitors are reminded the Society and or the Judge has the right to not award premiums for an unworthy exhibit.
10. Herd's person must care for exhibits at least twice daily, if not more.
11. No other animals are allowed in the goat barn.
- 12. Exhibitor passes are \$10.00 each and include parking when available. Passes are non-transferable and will be sold only to those exhibiting animals all week. Children 12 and under are admitted free all week. Those who bring in animals for just the one show will not get passes; their names will be left at the gate.**
13. No horned animals allowed.
- 14. Each breed must be entered on a different entry form. Please keep numbers in numerical order as they appear in the premium book, as this will reduce errors.**
15. All dairy goats are entered at the sole risk of the owners.
16. All tattooing is to be done prior to entering the fair grounds, and must be legible.
- 17. No one under the age of 6 will be able to show or enter the show ring with an animal, this includes with parental supervision.**
18. If you are housing with other animals from a different farm, please note this on the entry form.
- 19. A.O.P. to include: Saanen; Sable; and Nigerian Dwarfs**
20. The Goat Superintendent is authorized to cause the removal from the buildings and grounds of any failing to meet the Health Requirements specified or if so instructed by the State Inspector. The Management assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to stock or to any exhibits from any cause, and reserves the right to order any examination or test deemed necessary to determine the existence of any suspected disease or condition in any animal exhibited.
- 21. Only exhibitors who are staying all week will be permitted to stay overnight in the goat barn.**

Animal Health Requirements For
Admission to New York State and County Fairs
(Part 351 of NYS Agriculture and Markets Regulations)

General Prohibitions and Requirements

- No person shall bring or have present an animal on the fairgrounds during a fair which is not qualified under NYS regulations.
- No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by anyone other than the issuing veterinarian or an authorized agent.
- Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.

- Representatives of the Commissioner may deny admission to or require removal from the fair premises, or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of or exposed to any infectious, contagious or communicable disease.

Note: The fair board of directors has the authority to reject unworthy or unsightly exhibits for reasons other than infectious, contagious or communicable disease (Part 350.10). The state veterinarian or animal health inspector will bring questionable exhibits to the attention of the fair board.

- All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet all New York State importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the fair animal health requirements.

Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

- Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, deer, monkeys, misc. ruminants, camels and elephants require a valid CVI to enter the fairgrounds.
- The CVI must be issued by an accredited veterinarian.
- All animals must be uniquely identified. All manmade ID must be recorded. Refer to Animal Identification section below for more information.
- The type and duration of certificate required depends on the origin of the livestock.

New York Origin Livestock:

- A valid intrastate CVI (AI 61) is required.
- Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI.
- The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year.

Out of State Origin Livestock:

- All animals entering New York State must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of issuance. During the fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVI's can be used multiple times for entrance into fairs. The initial entrance into a fair must be within 30 days of issuance. In order for the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a state official noting the location of the initial fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI.

Animal Identification

- Animals requiring a CVI must be uniquely identified. Acceptable forms of unique identification include official eartag, registration tattoo, electronic identification or a sketch or photograph signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian who has inspected the individual animal.
- An eartag with a handwritten or printed number that is not unique is not acceptable.
- If electronic ID is utilized as the sole form of identification, the exhibitor is responsible for supplying a working electronic reader. If electronic ID cannot be read entry will be denied.
- Acceptable identification allows positive matching of the animal to all accompanying documents including papers with laboratory test results and vaccination statements.
- Horse sketches and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars and other markers.
- Llama and alpaca drawings must positively identify the individual animal.
- A name or a statement of color without additional distinguishing features or man made identification is not acceptable identification.
- USDA approved scrapie identification is required for all sheep and goats.

Rabies Vaccination

- Current rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 105 days or older on the date of admission to the fair.
- An animal is currently vaccinated beginning 14 days following primary (initial) vaccination continuing for the period stated in the manufacturer's instructions.
- Rabies vaccine label instructions allow vaccination as early as 84 days of age. This allows a one week window between 84 and 91 days of age (105 minus 14 days) where vaccine can be administered to meet the 105 day requirement.
- If an animal reaches the minimum age for rabies vaccination during the fair season, the vaccination requirement must be met even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate.
- **Note:** Individual fairs can require animals for which there is no approved rabies vaccine to be currently vaccinated for rabies. The requirements outlined above would apply. The fair is responsible for notifying exhibitors.

The New York State Fair requires rabies vaccination for all livestock species entering the grounds as well as all other mammalian species that have direct contact with the public.

Acceptable Proof of Rabies Vaccination

- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include a signed written statement from the attending veterinarian or a valid certificate of veterinary inspection that has the vaccination listed and is signed by the attending

veterinarian.

- Acceptable proof of vaccination must include the name of the product used, the date of administration and the duration of immunity if longer than one year.
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is included on an EIA test record, it must be signed separately in addition to the required EIA test record signature.
- **NOTE:** Rabies titers are not acceptable proof of rabies protection and cannot be used to meet entry requirements.
- Acceptable proof of vaccination for dogs is a valid vaccination certificate or a copy of the dog license that contains the rabies vaccination information.

Cleaning and Disinfection

- All buildings on the fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected prior to the opening of the fair and between groups of animals when housing is rotated (Section 50.2 of Agriculture and Market regulations).

Kidding and Lambing

- Due to the concern about the spread of scrapie, any sheep or goats that are exhibited at a county fair that have recently given birth or have a vaginal discharge, will be ordered removed along with their offspring.
- The causative agent for scrapie may be present in high concentration in fluids associated with birth and the risk of transmission is considered highest at that time.

Commingling of Sheep and Cattle

- Due to the potential spread of malignant catarrhal fever from sheep to cattle, it is recommended that cattle be kept separate from sheep.

Isolation on Returning Home

- The owner or custodian shall keep show animals biologically separate from the herd or flock for a period of at least two weeks after returning to the premises of origin.

Goats

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals individually identified with USDA approved individual scrapie program identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible registration tattoo or 3) a USDA approved herd tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic ID if the goat is enrolled in the Scrapie

Flock Certification Program and/or the electronic ID is recorded on the goats registration paper (owner must supply a working electronic reader). For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 518-218-7540.

- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing accredited veterinarian that the herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of soremouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any goat, the entire exhibit including the affected animals shall immediately be removed from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately after removal.

2. Barn space will be provided only for those animals staying on the grounds all week.

3. Entries staying all week (from the first Sunday to the last Sunday of the Fair) **will receive a 20% increase in premium money.**

4. Junior Does in all breeds will show first, then Senior Does.

5. Junior and Senior does are separately sanctioned

6. No other animals are allowed in the goat barn.

7. No horned animals allowed.

8. **Exhibitor passes are \$10.00 each and include parking when available. Passes are non-transferable and will be sold only to those exhibiting animals all week. Children 12 and under are admitted free. Those coming in for "one day" show do not need to purchase passes. Exhibitor name will be left with back gate personnel.**

9. When making entries, each breed needs to be entered on a different entry form. Please keep entries in numerical order, as they appear in the premium book, as this will help reduce errors.

10. All animals are entered at the sole risk of the owners.

11. **No one under the age of 6 will be able to show or enter the show ring with an animal, this includes with parental supervision.**

12. **A.O.P. includes: Saanen; Sable; and Nigerian Dwarfs.**

13. **Any animal that is determined to be unfit for exhibition by the Department Superintendent must be removed from the fair grounds immediately and will not be judged or receive premiums.**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR OPEN DOE SHOW
ADGA RULES SHALL GOVERN**

This show is sanctioned by ADGA for both Junior and Senior Doe shows, the following breeds both foreign and domestic registry: Alpine; Oberholsti; lamancha; Nubian; Toggenburg; A.O.P.; Recorded Grades; and Nigerian Dwarfs.

**2008-2009 RULES GOVERNING THE CONDUCT
OF OFFICIAL ADGA SHOWS**

The intent and spirit of the show rules is to provide fair competition to exhibitors and their animals on a nondiscriminatory basis.

A. ELIGIBILITY

1. Only American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society and Canadian Goat Society registered, recorded or applied for animals, that are recognized by ADGA as dairy animals, may be shown in official American Dairy Goat Association shows.
2. A registration or recordation certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and may be required for animals under six months of age if the show so chooses.
3. A registration or recordation certificate or a stamped duplicate application showing the date received by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age. Show officials shall not accept copies of the aforesaid, any other document in lieu of them, or information obtained from the ADGA office via telephone, etc.
4. **A stamped duplicate is valid for 30 days from the ADGA office date stamped on it**
5. The document for that animal to be shown must be handed to the show official who shall read it and compare its information to that on its entry form and verify the information on both.
6. All names included on one identification number constitute only one membership; therefore, only one exhibitor. Only the ID number on the registration/recordation certificate or on the stamped duplication application is proof of ownership.
6. Persons showing animals whose registration/recordation certificates have signed transfers that have not been processed by the ADGA office must show those animals in the owner's name shown on ADGA records at that time.
8. Animals with natural horns shall not be shown.
9. Both Senior and Junior shows are separately sanction shows.
10. Base date for computing age of Dairy Goats is the date of the show.
11. The junior division consists of does under 24 months of age, which are not in milk.
12. Any doe that has ever freshened or that is being milked regularly shall compete in a senior doe show or senior doe division. This includes dry and precocious milker's.
13. Health: All dairy goats must be vet checked on the grounds before unloading. NYS Health standards apply. Check with your Vet to be certain to obtain NYS Health certificates. Out of state Exhibitors will need Health Permits. Vets decision is final.
14. **Required registry and recordation papers: An original registration certificate is required for all animals 6 months of age or older. An ADGA stamped duplicate application of registry is accepted for dairy goats less than 6 months of age. A completely filled out and signed certificate or transfer on certificate of registry recordation will be accepted for proof of ownership.**
15. Judging will begin at approximately 9:00 a.m. on Sunday the last day of Fair.
16. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern.

17. Judges decisions are final... Entries may not be added or withdrawn from classes after they have entered the show ring, and the judge has started.
18. All Dairy Goats are entered at the sole risk of the owner.
19. All Grand Champion and Reserved Grand Champion Does must remain on the grounds until the end of judging for "Best Doe in Show".
20. Make sure that all Tattoos' are legible.
21. There will be no pre- show milk out.
22. A.O.P. includes: Saanen; Sable; and Nigerian Dwarfs
23. **Any animal that is determined to be unfit for exhibition by the Department Superintendent must be removed from the fair grounds and will not be judged or receive premiums.**

8. **IF YOU ARE HOUSING WITH ANOTHER FARM YOU CAN USE ONLY ONE FARM NAME TO ENTER.**
9. **FARM SIGN MUST BE AT LEAST 12 X 36 OR GREATER.**
