**\*\*\*Please Note: Entries will be dated as they are received. Depending on the number of entries and space availability, latest may be refused.**

**\*\*\* Colored Breeds:** Must be in place by 11 am Sunday, August 8<sup>th</sup> by 11 A.M. and will be released at approximately 8 pm Wednesday, August 11<sup>th</sup>.

**\*\*\* Holsteins / Beef:** Must be in place by 11 am Thursday, August 12<sup>th</sup> and will be released at approximately 8 pm, on Sunday, August 16<sup>th</sup>.

All attendants in charge of animals will be subject to the orders of the Cattle Superintendent. All animals will be stabled under his direction.

The Cattle Superintendent may grant permission for late arrival of animals being shown at a show which conflicts with the above times. Permission must be requested and arrival times arranged in advance.

Once cattle are on the grounds, no animals are to leave and no switching of animals!! Anyone doing so will forfeit all premiums!!

Exhibitors are expected to provide their own livestock bedding, feed, feeding utensils, and containers and all necessary equipment. Exhibitors are also to keep stalls and surroundings in clean condition. All litter must be deposited in a place designated by the superintendent.

**Vehicles cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock barns because of fire regulations. Vehicles must be parked in area assigned by the superintendent.**

**Area in front of Milk-house must be kept open at all times – no feed or feed supplies are to be stored in this area.**

Animals are entered at the sole risk of the owners.

Milking Facilities: Please use courtesy and common sense when approaching and exiting the milking parlor. Each Exhibitor is responsible for cleaning up after their animals. Check with the Parlor Superintendent for milking hours.

Fluid Milk is not accepted from cows that are:

1. Producing colostrums milk
2. Producing mastitic or flaky milk
3. Being treated with antibiotics

**PRODUCERS WHO INTRODUCE UNACCEPTABLE MILK TO THE BULK TANK MAY BE REQUIRED TO PAY FOR ANY MILK THAT IS CONTAMINATED BY THEIR PRODUCT. PLEASE ALERT PARLOR ATTENDENT IF THERE IS A TREATED ANIMAL EACH AN EVERY TIME YOU ENTER THE MILKING PARLOR WITH THE TREATED ANIMAL. WE RELY ON SALE OF MILK FOR OPERATION OF PARLOR AND TO PAY PARLOR ATTENDENT.**

# CATTLE RULES AND REGULATIONS

### Animal Health Requirements For Admission to New York State and County Fairs (Part 351 of NYS Agriculture and Markets Regulations)

#### **General Prohibitions and Requirements**

- No person shall bring or have presented an animal on the fairgrounds during a fair which is not qualified under NYS regulations.
- No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by anyone other than the issuing veterinarian or an authorized agent.
- Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.
- Representatives of the Commissioner may deny admission to or require removal from the fair premises, or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of or exposed to any infectious, contagious or communicable disease.

Note: The fair board of directors has the authority to reject unworthy or unsightly exhibits for reasons other than infectious, contagious or communicable disease (Part 350.10). The state veterinarian or animal health inspector will bring questionable exhibits to the attention of the fair board.

- All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet all New York State importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the fair animal health requirements.

#### **Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)**

- Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, deer, monkeys, misc. ruminants, camels and elephants require a valid CVI to enter the fairgrounds.
- The CVI must be issued by an accredited veterinarian.
- All animals must be uniquely identified. All manmade 10 must be

recorded. Refer to Animal Identification section below for more information.

- The type and duration of certificate required depends on the origin of the livestock.

#### **New York Origin Livestock:**

- A valid intrastate CVI (AI 61) is required.
- Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI.
- The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year.

#### **Out of State Origin Livestock:**

- All animals entering New York State must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of issuance. During the fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVI's can be used multiple times for entrance into fairs. The initial entrance into a fair must be within 30 days of issuance. In order for the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a state official noting the location of the initial fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI.

#### **Animal Identification**

- Animals requiring a CVI must be uniquely identified. Acceptable forms of unique identification include official eartag, registration tattoo, electronic identification or a sketch or photograph signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian who has inspected the individual animal.
- An ear tag with a handwritten or printed number that is not unique is not acceptable.
- If electronic ID is utilized as the sole form of identification, the exhibitor is responsible for supplying a working electronic reader. If electronic ID cannot be read entry will be denied.
- Acceptable identification allows positive matching of the animal to all accompanying documents including papers with laboratory test results and vaccination statements.
- Horse sketches and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars and other markers.
- Llama and alpaca drawings must positively identify the individual animal.

- A name or a statement of color without additional distinguishing features or man made identification is not acceptable identification.
- USDA approved scrapie identification is required for all sheep and goats. See the sheep and goat sections below for more specific information.

### **Rabies Vaccination**

- Current rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 105 days or older on the date of admission to the fair.
- An animal is currently vaccinated beginning 14 days following primary (initial) vaccination continuing for the period stated in the manufacturer's instructions.
- Rabies vaccine label instructions allow vaccination as early as 84 days of age. This allows a one week window between 84 and 91 days of age (105 minus 14 days) where vaccine can be administered to meet the 105 day requirement.
- If an animal reaches the minimum age for rabies vaccination during the fair season, the vaccination requirement must be met even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate.
- **Note:** Individual fairs can require animals for which there is no approved rabies vaccine to be currently vaccinated for rabies. The requirements outlined above would apply. The fair is responsible for notifying exhibitors.

### **Acceptable Proof of Rabies Vaccination**

- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include a signed written statement from the attending veterinarian or a valid certificate of veterinary inspection that has the vaccination listed and is signed by the attending veterinarian.
- Acceptable proof of vaccination must include the name of the product used, the date of administration and the duration of immunity if longer than one year.
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is included on an EIA test record, it must be signed separately in addition to the required EIA test record signature.
- **NOTE:** Rabies titers are not acceptable proof of rabies protection and cannot be used to meet entry requirements.
- Acceptable proof of vaccination for dogs is a valid vaccination certificate or a copy of the dog license that contains the rabies vaccination information.

## **BVD-PI Testing**

- All cattle exhibited at NY county fairs or the State Fair must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). Also, starting in 2009, all llamas, alpacas, guanacos and vicunas (new world camelids) must be test negative for BVD-PI. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, the identification of the animal and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test is not verifiable the test must be repeated.

## **Cattle Testing:**

- Currently acceptable BVD tests for cattle less than 61 days old:
  - Skin notch Antigen Capture ELISA (ACE) or Immunohistochemistry (IHC)
  - whole blood virus isolation
  - whole blood PCR
- Currently acceptable BVD tests for cattle 61 days of age and older:
  - Skin notch Antigen Capture ELISA (ACE) or Immunohistochemistry (IHC)
  - Serum or milk Antigen Capture ELISA (ACE)
  - Whole blood virus isolation
  - Whole blood, serum or plasma PCR

**Note:** The Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University can conduct testing on pools of up to 10 cattle.

Llama, Alpaca, Guanaco, Vicuna Testing

- Currently Acceptable BVD tests:
  - PCR
  - Whole blood virus isolation

Note: The Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University can pool llama,

etc. samples for PCR testing as follows: Animals less than 61 days of age can be tested in pools of 2 animals, whole blood only. Animals 61 days of age and older can be tested in pools of 5 animals using whole blood, serum or plasma.

## **Cleaning and Disinfection**

- All buildings on the fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected prior to the opening of the fair and between groups of animals

when housing is rotated (Section 50.2 of Agriculture and Market regulations).

### **Commingling of Sheep and Cattle**

- Due to the potential spread of malignant catarrhal fever from sheep to cattle, it is recommended that cattle be kept separate from sheep.

### **Isolation on Returning Home**

- The owner or custodian shall keep show animals biologically separate from the herd or flock for a period of at least two weeks after returning to the premises of origin.

### **Cattle**

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals individually identified.
- Current rabies vaccination is required for all cattle 105 days of age or older (see above).
- All cattle must be must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). (See current acceptable tests above.) The date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- All cattle must be currently vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus, bovine virus diarrhea, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and parainfluenza with a product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for theses diseases for the duration of the fair.

1). The Cattle Superintendent is authorized to cause the removal from the buildings and grounds of any failing to meet the Health Requirements specified or if so instructed by the State Inspector. The Management assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to stock or to any exhibits from any cause, and reserves the right to order any examination or test deemed necessary to determine the existence of any suspected disease or condition in any animal exhibited.

2). Competition is not limited to Franklin County residents. Entry applications are available from the Franklin County Agricultural Society, P.O. Box 121, Malone, NY 12953. Phone: 518-483-0720 or Fax: 518-481-6219, Website: frcofair.com. Office hours are 8 A.M to 5 P.M.

3). An Entry Fee of 10% of first premium will be charged for each class entered. This Fee must be paid when entries are submitted.

4). **PASSES:** All Exhibitor Passes will be sold in the Fair Office when entries are made. Passes are restricted to Exhibitors & Family residing & working on the farm. Helper passes will only be given to Farms exhibiting 6 or more animals. One day entrance will be given to those who will be helping on the day of the show. Passes are \$10.00 each. Passes are non-transferable, children 12 and under are admitted free all week.

**5). Colored Breeds Entries must be submitted on or before Friday, July 16, 2010  
Holstein/Beef Entries must be submitted on or before Friday, July 23 2010**

- A. No additional entries will be accepted after the closing dates, however, substitutions within and between individual animal classes will be allowed. No substations between individual animal classes and group classes will be allowed. **To Clarify:** Any animal, any age, may replace any animal, any age. However, you may not cancel an individual and enter a group, or cancel a group and bring an individual.
- B. All substitutions must be presented to the Cattle Superintendent or his assistants before the show starts, except for fresh cows which may be changed from dry cow to milking cow up to the time the class enters the ring.
- C. When substitutions are made, only the difference between the class entry fees will have to be paid. No refund will be made when the entry fee for the substituted class is less than the originally entered class.

6). There are two ways for 4-Her to enter their animals in open class:

- A. By submitting an open class entry application by the deadline dates specified.
- B. After placing 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> in Youth Department, and upon immediate payment of class entry fee, the animal will automatically be entered. The entry fee for animals entered this way will be \$1.00 per entry, payable at show ring.

7). **Registration papers:** Registration Certificate of all entries must be available at the time of the show. It shall be the duty of each exhibitor to present his certificate of registration to the Superintendent or his Assistants in order for the animal to be eligible to show. Signed transfers may be accepted, along with the appropriate transfer fee. The Cattle Superintendent, or his Assistants, will check the registration paper and then give the paper, the completed transfer and the appropriate transfer fee to the appropriate Breed Association for processing. No premiums will be paid unless these papers are available.

- A. **Group classes:** At the time of showing either herd or groups, the exhibitor must supply the ring clerk with registration papers of various animals comprising the herd or group. The papers will be checked while the groups are in the ring.
- B. In cases deemed to be extreme by the Cattle Superintendent, he may use his discretion in allowing an animal to show based on his contract with appropriate Breed association or transfer from them.
- C. The Society reserves the right to withhold payment of all premiums on registered stock until satisfied as to the corrections of pedigree.

8). **Production Awards:** Will be given in all cow classes except for Junior 2 year old and Senior 2 year old and group classes. Awards will be based on last completed 305 days or less actual milk records. The combined pounds of butterfat and protein will determine production awards. Only official DHI production records will be accepted. DHI records must be presented to the Cattle Superintendent or his Assistants by 5 p.m. on the day prior to the show day unless another deadline is agreed upon by the Cattle Superintendent in advance. 3x records will be adjusted to 2x basis using conversion factors.

9). **Exhibitor:** An Exhibitor is the owner or farm appearing on the registration paper (or appropriate transfer) for the entry on show day. For the purpose of meeting the requirements in all group classes and for Premier Breeder, an Exhibitor is further defined as those members of an immediate family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit. **Each owner, however, must separate the entry forms with his/her entries at the time when entries are made.**

10). Exhibitor must wear proper exhibitor numbers in order for their animals to be judged and awarded a prize. For group classes, the attendant in charge of the group shall wear the numbers.

11). No animals may be shown in more than one individual class. For example, an aged cow can not show in the aged cow class and the 100,000 (125,000, Holstein show) lb. class, She can only show in one or the other. Red & Whites are eligible for Red & White show or Holstein Show (if registered with the Holstein Association), But not both.

12). All animals shown in group classes must also have been entered and shown in individual open classes.

- 13). Any Exhibitor who knowingly or otherwise enters an animal in a class for which it is not eligible, will be barred from showing their entry, and any premiums previously awarded for other classes will be forfeited.
- 14). An Exhibitor may show only one entry in Breeders Herd & Best Three Females. Please refer to #9.
- 15). If only one animal is shown in a class, the judge may award whatever placing he deems appropriate, not necessarily first place. He may also choose not to award a best udder ribbon.
- 16). The judge may, at his/her discretion, require any animal to be milked before him in the ring. Any exhibitor who refuses is subject to forfeiture of all premium moneys.
- 17). Any artificial means of removing or remedying physical defects or conformation in exhibition animals will be considered as fraud or deception. The management supports the recommended PDCA Show Ring code of ethics, which is printed at the end of these rules and regulations. All animals giving evidence of such treatments will be barred from exhibition at the Franklin County Fair.
- 18). The **decision of the judge shall be final** in all cases except where error, mistake, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases the decisions of the cattle superintendent shall be final.
- 19). Any protest must be submitted, in writing, to the cattle superintendent.
- 20). In case any premiums should be awarded to an exhibitor on animals shown in violation of the rules at any fair that is a member of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, the fair management, on obtaining conclusive evidence of such violation, will immediately request the exhibitor to refund all premium moneys, cups, trophies, and ribbons awarded in violation of this rule. Failure on the part of the exhibitor to comply with this request within 10 days will automatically bar them from all classes at the fairs or exhibitions of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions and they can be reinstated only by a majority vote of the Board of Directors of said associations.
- 21). Exhibitors are reminded that the Society, and/or judge, has the right to not award premiums for an unworthy exhibit. Please present your animals clipped and washed to the best of your ability.

22). The rules printed herein are made a part of the conditions which all entries of the exhibitors are made, and exhibitors are respectfully requested to read them carefully, thereby avoiding confusion at the time of the fair.

23). All cattle registry papers, tattoos for registered beef, and DHIA records for top production awards will be examined by cattle superintendent or assistant on the day prior to the show. **PLEASE** have all necessary paper work in order. Registry papers will not be checked at ringside for individual classes. Registry papers will be needed however for group classes. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.

**Please note:**

**No unauthorized people allowed in milk room**

**Also: for safety reasons, please keep small children out of milking parlor at milking times.**

**Clipping is NOT allowed in the milking parlor.**

**KEEP ALL TREATED ANIMALS IDENTIFIED AND OUT OF BULK TANK**

**State Health Requirement:**

**Do not remove anti-siphon devices on water faucets. This will be strictly enforced!!**

**It is now mandatory that each exhibitor house a functional fire extinguisher within their exhibit.**

**\*Proof of rabies vaccination is required on health charts\***

**Cattle show classes**

Colored Breed entries are due on or before Friday, July 16, 2010.

Colored Breeds are due in place Sunday, August 8, @ 11 A.M.

Colored Breeds will show on Tuesday, August 10 @ 9:00 A.M.

Holstein/Beef entries are due on or before Friday, July 23, 2010.

Holsteins are due in place on Thursday, August 12, @ 11 A.M.

Holsteins will show on Saturday, August 14 at 8:00 A.M.

Beef will show on Friday, August 13, at 9 A.M. starting with 4-H Beef Show.

4-H Colored Breeds will show on Monday, August 9, at 9 A.M. with showmanship followed by confirmation classes.

4-H Holsteins will show on Friday, August 13 at 9 A.M. with showmanship followed by confirmation classes. Open Beef Market classes will show in morning following Youth Beef Show.

Entry fee per class is 10% of first place premiums.

### Sections A to N

- A **Holsteins:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays 15 places and 5-6-7-8, which pays 10 places.
- B **Ayrshire:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays 10 places.
- C **Jersey:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays 10 places.
- D **Brown Swiss:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays 10 places.
- E **Guernsey:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays 10 places.
- F **Red and Whites:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays to 10 places. All animals must be registered with the Red and White Cattle Association, or the Holstein Friesian Association.
- G **Milking Shorthorn:** Pays 5-6 places, except classes 2-3-4 which pays to 10 places.
- H **Beef:** (all other breeds) Pays to 6 places for classes. **NOTE: this section is for all beef without registry papers, including Grade Angus and any other registered beef breeds without an assigned section Example: White Park, Hereford, etc.**
- L **Red Angus:** Pays to 6 places for classes. **(ONLY WHEN 10 OR MORE ENTERED) NOTE: must be registered with Red Angus Association.**
- M **Black Angus:** Pays to 6 places for classes. **(ONLY WHEN 10 OR MORE ENTERED) NOTE: must be registered with Black Angus Association.**
- N **Beef Market Classes**

**Best udder:** ribbon and \$20.00 for classes 12-20 in which judge designates such award.

**Top Production, Total Performance:** ribbon and \$20.00 for each award in classes 14-22, based on DHI records as specified in rule. Total performance points will be figured on total production and show placing points as per this system:
