1. Competition is open to Franklin County Residents only.
2. Pre-entries are required. Entry forms are available in the Fair Office, or by calling the Fair Office and requesting an entry blank at 483-0720. **Entry Forms are due on or before Friday July 23, 2010.**
3. All entries in Department 7 must be tagged and ready for displaying according to the rules. **ENTRIES NOT TAGGED PROPERLY ARE SUBJECTED TO DISQUALIFICATION.**
4. All exhibits must remain in place until the Monday following the closing of the Fair and must be picked up between 8 A.M. to 11 A.M. **No exceptions will be made to this rule.**
5. Vegetable Hall will be open daily, approximately 11 am to 7 pm; with the exception of the times when judging is taking place.
6. **Entry Fee is 10% of the first place premium.**
7. Entries must be in place by Friday August 6, 2010 at 3:00 pm.
8. All vegetables and seeds must have been raised by the exhibitor.
9. **All vegetables must be plainly labeled WITH THE VARIETY NAME, varieties distinctly off-type will be disqualified.**
10. All classes will be judged as follows: Quality (which includes uniformity in one form size and color) freedom from blemishes as well as edible quality – 75%, trueness to type – 25%.
11. An Exhibitor may have **two (2)** entries in each class, except class 74 and 160 (**only one (1) per class will be allowed**).
12. An Exhibitor having the most blue ribbons in Department E will receive a cash prize of \$10.00. Reserve will receive \$5.00.
13. Judging will take place at 5:00 pm on Friday August 6, 2010.
